**5.2.5 LOCAL SERVICE OPTIONS (CONT'D)**

C. Public Response Calling Service (PRCS) (T)

1. Description

Public Response Calling Service, also known as Choke Network, provides facilities for call-in programs, including but not limited to radio, television or internet promotional activities that result in mass calling by the general public to a telephone number. (C)

2. Terms and Conditions

a. Public Response Calling Service is offered to customers where the conditions listed below exist. The services offered are subject to the availability of the existing network facilities. The Company may revise or withdraw the service at any time with appropriate notice. (C)

b. In order to maintain the safety, continuity, and reliability of telephone service to the general public and 911 Service, those customers who solicit large volumes of incoming calls resulting in any of the conditions listed below, will be required to subscribe to PRCS, or modify or discontinue the call-in activity. Existing customers found to be using a business service inappropriately, generating large volumes of incoming calls that may adversely affect the service of other customers, may also be required to purchase PRCS.

- The number of incoming calls being directed to a specific telephone number exceeds 200 in a given hour of time,
- More than 15 percent of the calls to the specific telephone number reach a busy signal in a given hour,
- The number of busy signals to the specific telephone number exceeds 1,000 per week. (C)

c. PRCS lines may not hunt or call forward-busy to a non-PRCS line.

d. One or more exchange access lines may be provided for use with PRCS and the central office prefix assigned will be specified by the Company.

C.2. (Cont'd)

- e. PRCS is available only with incoming calling. Outgoing calling is not provided as a feature of this service. Callers to the PRCS telephone number from outside the local calling area may incur the appropriate toll charges. (C)
- f. The telephone number assigned to PRCS may be listed in the Company directory and on Directory Assistance records of the exchange from which the associated PRCS lines are furnished. Additional listings as specified in 5.7.1 of this Catalog may be purchased by the customer.
- g. Customers may not utilize *MARKET EXPANSION LINE* Service as a PRCS telephone number.
- h. Customers outside the central office where PRCS is provided may be served from the PRCS prefix. The calls must be directed to a standard exchange access line.
- i. Terms, conditions, rates and charges described elsewhere in the Company's tariffs apply as appropriate

**D. Dormitory Communication Service**

**1. General**

- a. Dormitory Communication Service (DCS) is available to accredited public and private educational institutions for residential use by students, faculty members, or employees who reside in dormitories or other residential quarters owned, leased, or under control of the educational institution.
- b. DCS is furnished from central office equipment located on Company premises and associated facilities arranged to provide the equivalent of residence individual line local exchange service. DCS lines furnished to an educational institution must be of the same class of residence individual line service, and a mix of different services is not permitted.
- c. The local calling area for DCS is the same as that specified in this Catalog for residence individual line service in the exchange in which the DCS central office equipment is located. DCS local calls, including calls between DCS lines served by the same DCS central office equipment, are subject to the same local exchange service usage charges as applicable to residence individual line service.

**2. Terms and Conditions**

- a. DCS is furnished to an educational institution upon the condition that use of the service shall not be made subject to any charge by the educational institution in excess of the charges set forth in the tariffs of the Company.
- b. The educational institution is responsible for payment of all charges except those set forth in c., following.

**5.2.5 LOCAL SERVICE OPTIONS**

D.2. (Cont'd)

- c. The Company will bill and collect DCS sent paid or collect long distance messages, telegrams, cablegrams, and radiograms. In addition, the Company will bill and collect local exchange service usage.
- d. The terms and conditions set forth in Section 2 for deposits and payment of service are applicable.
- e. The educational institution shall agree to render assistance to the Company in the prompt collection of charges billed to DCS lines.
- f. In the event of nonpayment of any charges billed, the Company may suspend or terminate a DCS line until all charges due have been paid. Service which is so suspended or terminated is subject to the charges specified in Section 2 for restoral or reestablishment of service.
- g. The nonrecurring charges specified previously in 5.2 for residence service apply to the service connection, move, and change of DCS.
- h. DCS lines may be temporarily suspended, at the educational institution's request, subject to the terms and conditions specified for the temporary suspension of individual line residence service in Section 2.
- i. The rates and charges specified for DCS lines in 3., following, do not include directory listings in the alphabetical section of the directory of the Company. Directory listings for DCS are furnished with the consent of the educational institution at the same rates and charges specified for residence additional directory listings in 5.7 of this Catalog.
- j. DCS extension station lines will be provided with the consent of the educational institution only within the same dormitory room or suite or other residential quarters as the associated DCS line.

- k. Subject to the availability and type of DCS central office equipment provided, and with the consent of the educational institution, DCS lines may be equipped for Touch-Tone Service and/or Custom Calling Service in 5.4.3, following, at the same rates and charges as specified for such services for residence individual lines. (C)
- l. The initial contract period for each DCS line is the same as the initial contract period specified for residence individual line service. (C)

E. Extension Service

1. General

- a. Extension Service provides the user with the capability for originating calls from or receiving calls at locations in addition to the location of the main line service.
- b. Extension Service is furnished in connection with all classes of individual and party line service.
- c. Extension Service may be installed only at locations where the use will be confined to the customer, employees or representatives engaged in the business, family unit or guests or persons permitted to use the service as provided for under the regulations governing joint user service.
- d. Extension Service may be installed at locations not on the customer's premises only when there is other telephone service at those locations adequate, in the opinion of the Company, to take care of exchange and toll requirements. Such service is installed subject to the transmission limitations of exchange circuits.
- e. If special construction is required in the installation of Extension Service, construction charges shall apply.
- f. Rates for Extension Service are as specified in the Private Line Transport Services Catalog.

**5.2.5 LOCAL SERVICE OPTIONS (CONT'D)**

**F. Incoming Lines and Trunks**

1. Customers for individual line business flat rate service, or private branch exchange service, may be provided, respectively, with one or more additional lines or trunks to be used exclusively for inward service from the central office.
2. Stations for terminating inward lines associated with individual line business service are not placed off the premises where the individual line service is located.
3. The monthly rate for each inward line is specified in 5.2.4.
4. The monthly rate for each inward trunk to a private branch exchange is as specified in 5.3 for the serving exchange.
5. Except in zoned areas or exchanges, extra exchange line mileage charges apply in addition to the monthly rate, if the station or private branch exchange in which the inward line terminates is located outside of the Base Rate Area of the exchange. In zoned areas or exchanges, mileage charges are not applied; rates are determined as in 3. and 4. above.

G. *STAND-BY* Line Service

1. Description

*STAND-BY* Line is an offering on a month-to-month basis which will allow business customers to expand access to their business and expand their capacity to make outgoing calls as needed. This service is designed for customers that experience periodic peaks and valleys in calling volumes to and from their business.

2. Terms and Conditions

- a. This service will be offered to business customers only.
- b. *STAND-BY* Line measures both incoming and outgoing calls on a per minute of use basis. The incoming and outgoing call capability is always active.
- c. Any mandated charges or special surcharges, e.g., 911, TDD, EUCL, Telephone Assistance Plan, will apply under the same terms as a measured business line.
- d. Directory Assistance and long distance service will apply under the same terms as a measured business line.
- e. Customers must have at least one flat rated business line at the location for which they are ordering *STAND-BY* Line service. *STAND-BY* Line cannot be used as the primary business line.
- f. No listing will be provided with the *STAND-BY* Line.
- g. Terms, conditions, rates and charges as described elsewhere in this Catalog, apply as appropriate.
- h. *STAND-BY* Line Service will be provided where technically and economically feasible.
- i. Customers are not charged to change from *STAND-BY* Line to an individual business line.
- j. *STAND-BY* Line Service may be temporarily suspended only when the main service with which it is associated is suspended. *STAND-BY* Line Service will remain at the full rate.

- k. The Initial Service Period described in Section 2 does not apply for *STAND-BY* Line Service.
- l. Nonrecurring charges apply to establish *STAND-BY* Line Service. In addition, nonrecurring charges, specified in Section 3 for USOC GCS, apply to change from an individual business line to *STAND-BY* Line Service.

**5.2.6 TELEPHONE ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

A. Lifeline Assistance

1. Description

The Lifeline Assistance Plan (Lifeline) assists qualified low-income applicants with reductions in their monthly local exchange service rate. The assistance applies for a single telephone line at the applicant's principal place of residence. Residents living on reservations can also qualify for the Federal portion of the Lifeline program based on terms and conditions for Tribal Lifeline.

2. Eligibility Requirements

- a. To be eligible for assistance, an applicant must participate in one of the following:

- Medicaid (e.g. Title XIX/Medical, state supplemental assistance)
- Food Stamps
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal public housing assistance
- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LHEAP)
- Temporary Assistance to Needy Family Program (TANF)
- National School Lunch Program (NSL)
- Meet Income-Based Criterion for Telephone Assistance, as defined by the FCC

3. Terms and Conditions

- a. An applicant may request telephone assistance through completion of a form provided by the Company.
- b. The Lifeline credit will apply to the following Local Exchange Service:

  - Hourly Usage Package Service

**B. Tribal Lifeline**

**1. Description**

Tribal Lifeline provides additional lifeline support of up to \$25.00, in addition to the baseline Federal Lifeline support for qualifying low-income individuals living on reservations as defined by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) regulations.

**2. Terms and Conditions**

a. Residents living on reservations are eligible for the Tribal Lifeline benefit if they participate in one or more of the following programs as identified by the FCC:

- Medicaid (e.g. Title XIX/Medical, state supplemental assistance),
- Food Stamps,
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI),
- Federal public housing assistance,
- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LHEAP),
- Bureau of Indian Affairs general assistance program,
- Tribally administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families block grant program,
- Head Start programs (only for those meeting its income-qualifying standard),
- National School Lunch Program's free lunch program,  
Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program,
- Meet Income-Based Criterion for Telephone Assistance, as defined by the FCC.

b. The Company must obtain the customers signature on a document in which the eligible customer certifies, under penalty of perjury, that such customer receives benefits from at least one of the programs above, and lives on a reservation. In addition to identifying the program or programs from which that customer receives benefits, the customer must also agree to notify the Company if that customer ceases to participate in the qualifying program or programs.

c. Tribal Lifeline benefits apply to the primary flat local residential access line, outside the base rate area and touch-tone service charges, mileage charges, zone charges, or other non-discretionary charges associated with basic residential service. The benefit may not bring the basic local residential access line rate below \$1.00 per month.

For Tribal Lifeline Customers, the ASGF2 reflects a \$1.75 additional credit plus the first \$1.75 of the Tribal Lifeline Credit. The remainder of the Tribal Lifeline Credit is reflected in the ASGFT amount. The Tribal Lifeline Credit is up to \$25.00, but no more than necessary to reduce the Tribal Lifeline rate to \$1.00. [2] The credit amount is calculated by adding the 1FR rate plus the \$6.46 subscriber line charge together. C. Link-Up

1. South Dakota residents who are participating in one of the eligible programs listed below may also qualify for the FCC's Link Up Program. A 50% discount (USOC LNK) up to \$30.00 will be applied to access line nonrecurring charges to connect service at a new address. This discount applies only on a single line at the principal place of residence for the applicant.
2. The consumer shall receive the benefit of the Link Up program for a second or subsequent time only for a principal place of residence with an address different from the residence address at which Link Up assistance was provided previously.

4. Application for Assistance

An applicant shall request telephone connection assistance through completion of a form provided by the Company.

5. Deferred Payments

An applicant may defer payment of the service connection charges. Payments may be deferred up to 12 months with a payment schedule of equal payments of up to \$200.00 assessed for commencing service. Interest will not be charged on deferred payments.

D. Expanded Link-Up Program

1. Description

Residents living on reservations who qualify for Tribal Lifeline, are eligible for an additional Expanded Link-Up benefit of up to \$70.00, in addition to the Link-Up Program. Therefore Link-Up benefits could total up to \$100.00. The additional benefit will apply towards 100% of the connection charges between \$60.00 and \$130.00 which are assessed to begin service at the principle residence of the eligible resident. Eligible charges include any charges customarily assessed to connect the subscriber to the network, including line extension charges, zone connection charges and special construction charges.

6. Additional lines may be added, but will not affect the monthly discount level.

7. If Qwest terminates the Service(s) for Cause, or if a customer terminates the Services(s) in whole without Cause before the expiration date, the Customer will pay termination charges \$15.00 per line of the customer's Minimum Line Requirement times the remaining number of months left on the Term. For example: a customer terminating all service with 3 months remaining on the Term and a Minimum Line Requirement of 50 lines will pay \$15.00 x 50 x 3 = \$2,250.00.

Annually, if an account falls below the Minimum Line Requirement for the discount tier, the customer will pay a shortfall penalty of \$60.00 for each line below the Minimum Line Requirement.

A termination charge will be waived if the Customer places an order to discontinue the service and replaces the line(s) within the Qwest region with similar Qwest contracted services equal to, or greater than, the remaining value of the commitment.

8. The customer may move the physical location of all or part of the lines in *LINE VOLUME ADVANTAGE* to another location within the Qwest region, or move within the following Qwest products, provided the new lines are provided to the customer by the Company:

- *QWEST CHOICE* Business
- *QWEST CHOICE* Business Plus
- Add-A-Line
- *QWEST CHOICE* Business Prime

9. The Company may vary *LINE VOLUME ADVANTAGE* terms and conditions, excluding discount levels, to meet a specific customer's request provided the changes are mutually agreed upon by the customer and the Company.
